



## TRAP PROCEDURE

- 1) Trap will be held on Tuesdays starting at 1:30pm with each round of 25 shots costing \$5.00
- 2) Trap will be held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday from 10:00am to 2:00pm
- 3) Procedure
  - a. Have shooters sign in using trap scoring sheets
  - b. When shooters register each shooter will sign the Waiver sheet.
  - c. The rules of the range will be reviewed with all shooters
  - d. Once there are 5 registered shooters a team will be formed and will shoot on trap range 1. Only trap ranges 1, 2, and 3 will be used.
  - e. If a team comes with 5 shooters that team will be assigned the next open trap range.
  - f. After two rounds on each range shooting will be stopped and the trap houses will be checked for the need of birds. A cone will be placed on the top of the trap house to indicate that someone is down range
  - g. If juniors shoot (under 18) the first round will be free and the remaining rounds will be \$2.00 each.
  - h. When each squad completes their rounds, the proper amount of money will be collected
- 4) What to bring
  - a. Eye protection
  - b. Ear protection
  - c. Shotgun
  - d. 25 shells for each round
- 5) At the end of all rounds the S.L.C.F.S.A. Committee Activity Report will be completed.
- 6) Rules
  - a. All shotguns unloaded and barrels open or chambers open
  - b. Shotguns will only be loaded at the stations
  - c. Shotguns are always pointed down range
  - d. At the end of each round shotguns will be secured and all shells will be picked up (if a squad is shooting multiple rounds this procedure can be done at the end of the rounds)
